7.5 PROXIES: Every member holding voting rights shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of OCIA International by proxy. This proxy must be assigned to a specific member (Chapter, Community Grower Group, Processor/Handler, or Producer At Large) or his/her delegate. No one is allowed to hold the proxied voting rights of more than two other members. A voting member (Chapter, Community Grower Group, Processor/Handler, or Producer At Large) may hold a maximum of two (2) proxies, plus their own vote. All proxies shall be in writing and signed and dated. Proxies are validated by the Election Committee for one meeting only.

7.5.1 **Proxy Assignment:** To establish quorum, proxy forms shall be mailed 45 days prior to AGMM. Members are encouraged to delegate proxies with specific voting instructions. All proxied voting rights not specifically registered with the Secretary or assigned prior to the call of the AGMM shall revert to the Election Committee solely for establishment of quorum.

This proxy form is only valid for the 2025 Annual General Membership Meeting (AGMM). Only a designated delegate of a member (Chapter, Processor/Handler, Producer-at-Large, Community Grower Group, General Member) may hold a proxy. A voting member (Chapter, Processor/Handler, Producer-at-Large, Community Grower Group, General Member) may hold a maximum of two (2) proxies, plus their own vote. (See OCIA Bylaw 7.5.) All proxy forms must be signed and dated by 1) the person assigning proxy rights and 2) the delegate receiving proxy rights.

You are encouraged to provide designated proxy holders with instructions on how you want to vote. Proxied voting rights must be registered prior to the Call to Order of the AGMM. (See Bylaw 7.5.1.) You may register your proxy by faxing a copy of the signed and dated proxy to the International office. To assist the Election Committee in assuring the establishment of a quorum so that transaction of AGMM business may begin on schedule, please register your proxy by January 18th, 2025. Bring the signed proxy form with you to the AGMM. If submitting proxy form by fax or scanned e-mail, the transmitted document must bear a header line indicating the date of transmission. The proxy assignor and the delegate receiving proxy should retain copies of the signed proxy form. However, if, for some reason, you do not wish your proxy voted, you may designate the Election Committee as your designated proxy holder and your vote will then be used solely for establishment of quorum.

Please note the record date for determining members entitled to vote shall be thirty days before the start of the Annual General Membership Meeting (See OCIA Bylaw 7.1). To participate as a member in the 2025 AGMM, dues must be paid by January 1st, 2025.

The following is a proposed amendment to **Article 3: Location, Fiscal Year, and Language, Sections 3.1.1 and 3.1.2** of the 2024 OCIA International Bylaws. *Italicized and bold text* reflect changes or additions to the existing Bylaws, and deletion of words are represented by the **strikeout** of existing Bylaws text.

Article: 3 LOCATION, FISCAL YEAR and LANGUAGE

- **3.1.1 Satellite Offices:** The OCIA International Board of Directors may authorize satellite offices to provide services to OCIA members (Chapters, Processors/Handler *Direct Associates*, CGG, PAL, General) in a set geographic area. The management of a Satellite office shall be in conformity with the Standards, Bylaws and policies of OCIA International
- **3.1.2** Regional Offices: A Regional office is an producer OCIA member-owned and controlled legal entity of producers, processors and/or handlers which has received delegated authority from OCIA International to correlate paperwork needed for OCIA International certification decisions and directly deal with applicants to insure consistency. All certification decisions, oversight, review and audit shall be made by OCIA International, be it on site or at the main office. Regional offices may be organized along regional or national lines to include OCIA applicants within regions and/or nation states. Regional offices may directly accept applications and payment in US\$ dollars and/or local currency from producers, processors, handlers, brokers, traders and retailers subject to OCIA International oversight.

The following is a proposed amendment to **Article 4: Certification, Sections 4.1a, 4.2, 4.3.2, 4.3.3** of the 2024 OCIA International Bylaws. *Italicized and bold text* reflect changes or additions to the existing Bylaws, and deletion of words is represented by the strikeout of existing Bylaws text.

Article 4: CERTIFICATION

- **4.1 ACCESS TO SERVICES:** OCIA makes its certification services accessible to all applicants who are in compliance with Organic certification program standards as offered by OCIA. There are no undue financial or other conditions. Access is not conditional upon the size of operation or membership in any association or group. Certification is not conditional upon the number of certificates already issued.
- **a.** There will be a limit *goal* of sixty (60) days maximum, from the time the International office receives a complete annual certification file, until the applicant is notified of the status of his or her certification file.
- **4.2 APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION:** Application for certification shall be made to the OCIA International. Office., Satellite office or Regional office, which may review such applications for completeness. Notwithstanding the above the only body which currently holds the authority to make certification decisions is the OCIA International office.
- **4.3.2** Annual certification fees shall be payable in US currency or equivalent to OCIA International or designated entity on or before the thirty-first day following application. *New certification applications won't be accepted until payment is received in full*.

4.3.3 A Member in default of payment of certification fees for 90 days may be suspended or expelled in accordance with Article 5.2.2

The following is a proposed amendment to Article 5: Categories of Affiliation, Association Privileges and Responsibilities, Sections 5.1, 5.1.1 (b.), 5.1.1.1, 5.1.1.2, 5.1.1.3, 5.1.1.4, 5.1.1.5, 5.1.2, 5.1.3, 5.1.4, 5.1.5, 5.1.6, 5.1.7 and 5.2.4.3 of the 2024 OCIA International Bylaws. *Italicized and bold text* reflect changes or additions to the existing Bylaws, and deletion of words is represented by the strikeout of existing Bylaws text.

Article: 5 CATEGORIES OF AFFILIATION, ASSOCIATION PRIVILEGES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- 5.1 AFFILIATION: Affiliations are outlined below and will hereafter be referred to as OCIA Member
- **5.1.1 Chapters:** Producer-owned and controlled legal entities of at least five farmers which meet OCIA procedural, and organizational norms as detailed in the Bylaws, policies and Certification Standards, and which among other things:
 - a. Provide an on-going program of organic crop improvement. b. Facilitate impartial and independent third-party certification.
 - c. Educate Chapter Associates as to the inherent value of use and promotion of the OCIA name, logo, and certification mark
 - **5.1.1.1 Producer:** A person whose activity consists of the production (including on-farm processing) and sales of food, feed, livestock, or fiber grown on his/her farm. may apply for certification through an OCIA chapter unless he/she falls under one of the exceptions to this Article. Chapter Producers' voting privileges within the Association are through the relevant chapter as described in Article 7.4.1.
 - a. Total annual certified acres shall not exceed 10,000.
 - **5.1.1.2 Producer/Processor:** A producer who is also doing processing. may apply for certification through the local chapter with the following conditions:
 - a. An inspector approved for both farming and processing operations must conduct the annual certification inspections.
 - Producer/Processors who meet the above conditions have voting privileges within the Association through the relevant chapter as described in Article 7.4.1.
 - If the above conditions do not apply, producers who are also doing processing may have their processing operation directly certified through OCIA International. Application for certification can be made through the relevant Satellite office or the relevant Regional office, as a Processor/Handler, but not through a chapter. In that case, their voting privileges within the Association are those of Processor/Handlers as described in Article 7.4.2

- **5.1.1.3 Chapter Processor/ Handler:** A processor/ handler may apply for certification through the be a member of the local chapter if the following condition applies:
- Total annual OCIA certified revenues for processing services and/or products do not exceed US \$500,000.
- 5.1.1.4 Cooperative: A production or service-providing organization owned and operated by OCIA certified growers in order to accomplish any or all of the following:
- a. Gather and co-mingle product for sale.
- b. Add value to product by cleaning, bagging, shelling, sorting, etc.
- c. Appeal to buyers by providing consistent supply of product.
- d. Process/manufacture product.
- e. Slaughter, package and/or sell meat, poultry, fish and/or products therefrom.
- Cooperatives may apply for certification through the local chapter. In that case, Cooperatives have voting privileges within the Association through the relevant chapter as described in Article 7.4.1
- -Cooperatives may become directly certified through OCIA International, as Processor/Handlers with the voting privileges described in Article 7.4.2.

5.1.1.5 *5.1.2* **Community Grower Groups (CGGs):** Groups of growers/harvesters may become certified as CGGs through the OCIA International office, and can apply for certification through the relevant Chapter or Reginal office, if they fulfill the following criteria:

- **a.** The group shall be constituted of producers with similar farming systems and production:
 - Growers/harvesters show commitment to sustainable agricultural practices suitable for their geographic region.
 - Growers/harvesters are located in the same geographical area and in close proximity to each other. The important factor is that the conditions influencing all members of the group might reasonably be expected to be similar throughout the region.
 - Agricultural practices within the group are uniform and reflect a consistent approach to cultivation.
- **b.** Each individual grower/harvester should have sales of OCIA certified produce of less than US \$5000.00. If over US \$5000.00 for two consecutive years, an individual inspection will be required.
- **c.** Management of grower/harvester group is centralized, i.e., formally organized as a crop improvement group, or they market their product through the same handler.
- **d.** The group has established and implemented a system to monitor their members with regard to organic agricultural practices (self-control or peer evaluation). Oversight must be provided by a local resource person, crop consultant or agronomist who must, in the course of a year, physically visit all farms in the area or in the group. These activities must be managed by the governing body.

CGG's voting privileges within the Association are as described in Article 7.4.4 For those CGG's who are members of Chapters, their voting rights are reflected in 7.4.1.

5.1.3 Producer at Large: Direct Associate: Farmers who operate in areas where there is as yet no OCIA chapter or Operations where there is no desire by the applicant to become a member of a chapter may become Ddirectly certified through OCIA International. They are encouraged to form or join a chapter at the earliest possible date and agree to use, promote and benefit the OCIA name, logo and mark. Producer at Large Direct Associates' voting privileges within the Association are as described in Article 7.4.3.

5.1.3 Processor/Handler: Merchants or processors of food, feed, or fiber that they did not themselves produce, who wish to carry on the OCIA certification guarantee for any product other than an unaltered package already bearing the seal may become directly certified through OCIA International. Processor/Handlers shall use, promote and benefit the OCIA name, logo and seal. Processor/Handlers shall respect producer independence and brand neutrality by developing and supporting chapters in those areas where they purchase or process product. Cooperatives as defined below shall be considered Processor/Handlers if their total annual OCIA certified sales exceed US \$500,000.

Processor/Handlers' voting privileges within the Association are as described in Article 7.4.2.

5.1.4 Contract Growers and Contract Grower Groups

Contract Growers and Contract Grower Groups are non-voting Associates whose products are indirectly certified under the sponsorship of a certified Processor/Handler. Such Associates may become indirectly certified only through the OCIA International office.

- **a.** Contract Growers and Contract Grower Groups are to be invited to become directly certified on their own at each anniversary of certification.
- **b.** The certification category of any Contract Grower or Contract Grower Group shall be reviewed annually.
- **c.** Contract Growers and Contract Grower Groups have the opportunity for participation and input into Association Standards, Bylaws, policies and procedures through their contract holder.
- 5.1.5 Contract Processor: Non-voting Associates who process for one or more OCIA certified Chapter Producers, Producers at Large, Processor/Handlers, or General Members. Contract processors must be inspected as part of each certified Associate's certification. To assure and maintain brand neutrality, Contract Processors are to be invited to become directly certified on their own at each anniversary of certification.
- **5.1.4 Supporting Associate:** A non-voting, non-certified person or organization, who would like to support the overall goals and objectives of OCIA, may associate themselves with OCIA in this non-voting category.
- 5.1.7 General Members: Persons or organizations certified by OCIA to standards other than OCIA International Standards, who are not already represented as members elsewhere in these Bylaws.

 General members' voting privileges are described in section 7.4.5 of these Bylaws.
- **5.2.4.3** A member in default of payment of membership dues for 90 days may be suspended or expelled in accordance with Article 5.2.2.

Article: 6 LEVIES AND USER FEES

The Board of Directors may implement such levies, fees, certification agreements, etc. as are deemed appropriate. Such revenue shall support the administration of OCIA International, promotion of the certification mark, the work of the Certification Review Committee, crop improvement, and any other program, which the Board of Directors may approve. Levies and fees shall be payable in US currency, or its equivalent, as billed according to the certification mark agreement, invoice, or other instrument.

The following is a proposed amendment to **Article 7: General Membership Meetings, Sections 7.4.1, 7.4.2, 7.4.3, 7.4.5, 7.5, 7.6 and 7.7** of the 2024 OCIA International Bylaws. *Italicized and bold text* reflect changes or additions to the existing Bylaws, and deletion of words is represented by the **strikeout** of existing Bylaws text.

Article 7: GENERAL MEMBERSHIP MEETINGS

- **7.4.1 Chapters:** Ten votes for the first 10 members, 2 votes for each additional 10 certified members., and chapter CGGs would be counted as 1 vote for each 3 chapter CGGs.
 - a. Chapter voting rights may be held by one or more Chapter delegates, according to the Chapter's wish.
 - a.b. Chapter Supporting members: 5 members may be accounted for towards the first 10 members of the affiliated chapter.
- 7.4.2 Processor/Handler-Direct Associate: One vote per member.
- 7.4.3 Producer at Large: One vote per member.
- 7.4-3 Community Grower Group: Five Ten votes.
- 7.4.5 General Members: Those affiliated through a Chapter shall count toward the votes of the Chapter. Those affiliated through International shall have one vote.
- **7.5 PROXIES:** Every member holding voting rights shall be entitled to vote at any meeting of OCIA International by proxy. This proxy must be assigned to a specific *OCIA* member (Chapter, Community Grower Group, *or Direct Associate* Processor/Handler, Producer At Large or General Member) or his/her delegate that is not a member of a specific group that is already carrying 2 proxies. No one is allowed to hold the proxied voting rights of more than two other members. A voting *OCIA* member (Chapter, Community Grower Group, Processor/Handler, Producer At Large, or General Member) may hold a maximum of two (2) proxies, plus their own vote. All proxies shall be in writing and signed and dated. Proxies are validated by the Election Committee for one meeting only.
- **7.6 QUORUM:** The presence in person or by proxy of one-third of the membership votes shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The members present at a duly organized meeting can continue to do business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough members to leave less than a quorum. If a meeting cannot be organized because a quorum has not attended, those present may, except as otherwise provided by statute, adjourn the meeting to such time and place as they may determine. Those who attend the second of such adjourned meeting, although less than a quorum, shall nevertheless constitute a quorum for the purpose of acting upon any matter set forth in the notice of the meeting, stating that those members who attend shall constitute a quorum for the

purpose of acting upon such matter. Notice and documentation shall be given to each member of record entitled to vote at such an adjourned meeting at least 10 days prior to the day named for the second meeting.

7.7 SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES: If conditions don't allow for a safe in-person AGMM, then an emergency remote AGMM is allowed, subject to a unanimous vote by the Board of Directors. This must be communicated to the membership at least 90 days in advance. When triggered, this supersedes the in person requirement mentioned in bylaw 7.6.

Article 8: BOARD MEMBERSHIP NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

8.3 NOMINATIONS OF ELECTED POSITIONS: The Board of Directors shall be elected by the Membership at the Annual General Membership Meeting.

8.3.1 Qualifications: Only OCIA Members (of Chapters, Community Grower Groups, or Direct Associate Processors/Handlers, Producers At Large and General Members) may be nominated. Nominees must forward to the Chair of the Nominating Committee a written petition signed by at least 7 OCIA Members (of Chapters, Community Grower Groups, Processor/Handlers, Producers At Large and General Members) prior to the closing of the nominating period. Each **OCIA Member** may have one nominee for the Board of Directors. If two or more people wish to be nominees and are members of different entities but are also members of the same entity, only one of them may be nominated.

VOTING AND ELECTION

Frequently Asked Questions

Who are Voting Members?

Voting members are associates who have paid their dues according to their membership category as defined in article 4 of the OCIA Bylaws and have voting privileges as defined in articles 7.4.1-5.

In a nutshell voting members are Certified Producers-At- Large, Certified Processor/Handlers, Community Grower Groups, Cooperatives & Chapters who have paid their membership dues

How many votes do the different members get?

If membership dues are paid, Processors/ Handlers, Producers at Large & Cooperatives have one vote per member. Community Grower Groups are entitled 5 votes. Community Grower Groups or Cooperatives who are members of a chapter count only as a single member towards the chapters voting rights.

Chapters: Ten votes for the first 10 Members, 2 votes for each additional 10 certified Members, and Chapter CGGs will be counted as 1 vote for each 3 Chapter CGGs.

Who can be a Voting Delegate?

Delegates are individuals who are from within the member organization. For chapters and CGG's this implies that a delegate will be a member of the chapter or of the collective. For Processor/Handlers or Producers at Large; a delegate is an individual who has a structural link with the member such as an employee, shareholder, marketing agent, or a consultant under contract or retainer. Members can send as many delegates as they wish. Chapter voting rights/paddles may be held by one or more delegate.

If a Member has more than one vote, can the votes be split up between delegates?

Yes. At the time of registration, voting paddles can be divided between chapter delegates.

What if a delegate loses their voting paddle at the AGMM?

The voting paddles are a representation of the members vote. Each paddle will have the members name, and an Election Committee Members signature on it. If a voting paddle is lost, another delegate will not be able to use it for their votes, however, it will not be replaced.

What if a member can't attend the AGMM, can they still vote?

Yes. Every member holding voting rights are entitled to vote at the AGMM by proxy. The member must find a delegate of a member that would be willing to carry their proxy and vote according to their wishes. Remember, voting members can only carry two proxies in addition to their own votes. This means that a chapter can only carry two proxies and not each delegate of the chapter. Proxies must be fully completed and presented at AGMM Registration.
