Greetings everyone,

As the year comes to a close, it's the perfect time to reflect on all that has been accomplished. Your Board of Directors, together with the OCIA staff, has been working diligently to keep our organization relevant, financially stable, and aligned with the needs of our members. Enclosed is a brief summary of key developments and activities since my last report in May.

First, I'd like to commend our staff on the tremendous number of trade shows OCIA has participated in throughout 2025. By all accounts OCIA was present at more than 20 organic exhibitions this past year. If you attended any event related to organic agriculture, you likely saw OCIA represented. I'd also like to recognize board member, Jack Geiger who hosted a Farm Start event in August. Approximately 35 farmers attended his informative session in Robinson, Kansas. Best of all, the cost of participating in all of these trade shows – as well as Jack's Farm Start – was fully covered through TOPP (Transition to Organic Partnership Program) funds, thus preserving OCIA's own financial resources.

During the past few years our Executive Director and the Board have observed a generational shift among new farmers transitioning to organic production. Many newer producers prefer limited interaction and are comfortable conducting their own research. They seek basic fees and are less inclined to pay for additional services. Participating in local chapters is often not of interest to them. As times change, we must adapt as an organization.

To address this, the Board is now exploring the creation of an International Chapter that would provide an option for individuals seeking streamlined certification services, or those in geographic areas not currently served by a local chapter. This proposed chapter would not have voting rights, allowing our existing chapters to maintain leadership and decision-making authority.

# President's Message

We believe this option may help attract new members who might otherwise certify elsewhere. This proposal will be brought up for consideration at the 2026 AGMM (Annual General Membership Meeting).


In other news, our old office building located on 1340 Cotner Avenue in Lincoln, Nebraska was sold on November 21<sup>st</sup> for \$540,000. Originally purchased in 2007 for \$435,000 the sale allows us to move forward without the ongoing carrying costs associated with the property. The proceeds will considerably strengthen our financial position. Staff feedback on our new office located at 5910 S. 58<sup>th</sup> Street. Lincoln, Nebraska has been very positive, and we anticipate lower maintenance and operating costs moving forward.

While our membership has slightly declined again this year, this appears to be an industry-wide trend rather than an OCIA-specific issue. Despite the dip, our financial outlook remains strong. After making some adjustments, payroll expenses have decreased, and TOPP funding continues to support a significant part our marketing efforts and growth in the number of direct associates is helping offset chapter membership losses, often generating higher renewal revenue. Additionally, the sale of our old office building will decrease long term maintenance costs. I'd like to extend a special thank you to our OCIA Director of Finance, Deana McKinstry for her dedicated work.

In closing, I want to express my sincere appreciation to all of you for certifying with OCIA. This time of year, reminds us how fortunate we are to have members who are committed to producing healthy food for communities everywhere.

As a reminder our AGMM will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska on Thursday, February 12<sup>th</sup>, 2026. Members may attend in person or virtually via Zoom. As a membership led organization, your voice truly matters so please make time to participate.

# Treasurer's Message

Hello to all,

I had a dry fall for perfect harvest weather in Northeast Nebraska. Grain prices have finally turned in a positive direction in my area. Soybean yields were up this year.

The following report is a look at the finances for OCIA International.

Accounts receivables are up about 11% over last year. Membership and certification fees collected are down 4.2% and 3.4% from last year. Other operator fees and income are both up significantly. These two accounts added over \$100,000 to the bottom line.

On the expense side of the ledger, business insurance and financial expense were both up. The first one up 27% and the second one up 29%. These two expenses total almost \$30,000 this year.

Total income is up over both budget and last year.

The Internal Committee met November 12<sup>th</sup> via zoom. The master fee schedule and budget were both presented and approved. On the agenda also, were two bylaw changes. They were discussed and approved. The fee schedule and budget will be presented at the AGMM, along with the bylaw proposals.

We sincerely thank you for your continued support of OCIA International. We remain committed to moving forward and implementing positive improvements each year.

During 2025, as we took a deeper look into our internal processes for Pre-Inspection Reviews, Final Reviews, and inspection reporting, I am pleased to report a significant improvement in our turnaround times. On average, we are completing our final reviews 10 days faster than in 2024.

Our goal has been to improve clarity and consistency in communicating regulatory requirements to operations, and we hope you are finding our communications to be clear consistent, and helpful.

As a reminder, noncompliances are a normal part of the organic certification process. They are not intended to be punitive or overly critical, but rather are required by Organic Regulations. Operators are expected to respond to noncompliance notices promptly and thoroughly, so that OCIA can fulfill its responsibilities to our accrediting bodies.

We also encourage you to seek support and insights from fellow chapter members and certified organic farmers. As your certifier, OCIA is prohibited from offering consulting services or providing technical advice on how to correct specific noncompliances. If issues are not addressed adequately, OCIA is required to proceed with the next steps in the compliance process, which may include proposed suspension or other adverse actions. Timely and complete responses help avoid these outcomes. I encourage you to contact our team for any assistance we are permitted to provide.


